## Bachelor in Computer Information Systems

The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence (GGPE) is pleased to announce the second 'Believe Initiative' partnership with Monroe College (New York) for the Bachelor in Computer Information Systems (CIS) Scholarship.

The 4-year Scholarship which covers full tuition begins August 2017 and is tenable at Monroe College's New Rochelle Campus in New York.

Qualified Jamaican students desirous of pursuing a career in CIS are invited to submit their application online to Monroe College by Friday May 26, 2017.

### **Eligibility:**

1. Candidates must apply to Monroe College and be accepted having met their requirements.
2. The application must include the following information:
  - a. High School or College transcripts
  - b. At least seven CXC/CSEC passes (Grades 1 & 2)
  - c. At least three CAPE passes (Grades 1, 2 & 3)
  - d. Two letters of recommendation (one of which must be from his / her school Principal).
3. Candidates must have a strong sense of volunteerism and must demonstrate a willingness to contribute to Jamaica's growth and development.
4. Candidates must demonstrate the ability to fund the cost for living expenses and accommodation for the duration of the Bachelor's Degree programme.

**The successful candidate will be required to serve in Jamaica for a minimum of three (3) years following conferment of the Bachelor in Computer Information Systems degree.**
