The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence

The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence (GGPE) is made up of two (2) components – an awards programme, the Governor General's Achievement Award (GGAA) and a service-oriented programme, the

Believe Initiative (IBI).

The GGAA began in 1991 under the leadership of then Governor-General, Sir Howard Cooke and was later expanded by Governor-General Sir Kenneth Hall in 2006 to recognize youth ages 18 – 35 for excellence in academia and service, as well as individuals in the Diaspora who were making significant contribution to Jamaica and in their host country.

In 2011, the service-oriented programme for youth, the I Believe Initiative (IBI), was launched by Governor-General Sir Patrick Allen to motivate and inspire young people and also to give service to country. Its mantra is "using what is right with Jamaica to fix what is wrong with Jamaica." Its projects and activities are centred on three areas of emphasis: family, youth and education.

In 2014, the programmes coalesced and became the Governor-General's Programme for Excellence. The recipients of the GGAA will be recognized on the same basis with the proviso that their community service include activities reflecting the IBI's three (3) areas of emphasis. The GGPE continues to rely on the private sector for sponsorship of its annual activities. It also calls on the nation's fourteen (14) Custodes, the island-wide network of Justices of the Peace, "I Believe" Ambassadors and the Team at King's House for its effective functioning, diffusing its messages and maximizing its impact on the nation.

IBI Vision

In August, the Franklin Town Sports Centre was a bubbling playground of anxious children waiting to enjoy a day full of treats and entertainment put on by IBI Ambassador, Sheldon Millington, and the Elitte Club. The Franklin Town treat was one such project that forms the club's catalogue of charitable service. At the event, Ayrtons Distributors provided six back-to-school grants of \$20,000.00 each. The six recipients were also awarded scholarships at the event.

Club President, Millington commented that "[as] a small club of young men and women, some of us from the [very] same communities we serve... are motivated by the drive to help lift Jamaica's most vulnerable to a higher place and to support them through their journeys." He further explained that "when a child gets a new bag and new supplies to go to school, they really are more lifted and motivated to show up to school,". Mr. Millington shared that "the vulnerabilities of poverty can sometimes feel like a slave house that you can't get out on. But I also know that you can truly set someone free when you give them the gift of education".

A non-profit organization, The Elitte Club, undertakes a number of projects to aid in social development and educational upliftment for vulnerable youth across the island.

IBI Ambassador, Tishauna Mullings continues to showcase her commitment to her home parish of St. Thomas through her NexxStepp Lifelong Educational Programme, of which her 'Little Genius Competition' is an offspring.



As an IBI Ambassador, Ms. Mullings has built a brand that caters to youth and family as she takes an inter-generational approach to life transforming education. " During the year, the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Jamaica National Foundation awarded Ms. Mulling's NexxStepp Programme for rural regeneration. NexxStepp presents itself as the ultimate example of a rural social enterprise. Ms. Mullings commented that "NextStepp aims to be a friend of rural youths looking for an oasis in the wilderness of rural stereotypes and supposed lack of opportunities.



IBI-S.O.S.T.I. C SETS ROOTS IN EASTER N JAMAICA

The I Believe Initiative (IBI) endorsed the Save Our Schools Through Industries and Commitment (SOSTIC) agricultural project has reported many successes. In 2018, the novel agricultural initiative exhibited remarkable resilience even after many daunting challenges and naysayers.

A programme aimed at creating employment and healthy lifestyle through agricultural enterprises, reported a boost in its infrastructural framework and production output. Moving from zero, the operation now boasts a fully integrated irrigation system, food processing plant and ten green houses.

Among the main commodities being produced through the scheme are cold press coconut oil and castor oil, breadfruit and plantain flour, turmeric powder and paprika.

SOSTIC was launched in October 2015 as a pioneering initiative which uses greenhouse farming to create employment, revenue and promote healthy lifestyle in St Mary and Portland. In the early years of the project, it suffered theft, adverse weather conditions and plant diseases.

At the launch, in Dover, St. Mary, His Excellency the Governor-General revealed that the project was endorsed by the IBI on the premise that it is a prime example of how people can come together and, with vision, affect creative solutions for social, economic, and spiritual changes. The launch also featured workshops and presentations on topics such as grant funding, crop security and diet.

It is spearheaded by Pastor Arlington Woodburn of the North East Jamaica Conference (NEJC) of Seventh-day Adventists.

Hampton High School student, 18-year old Mackaylia Johnson is the 2018 recipient of the Governor-General's I Believe Initiative (IBI)-Monroe Scholarship. The scholarship made it possible for Mickaylia to commence a fouryear Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Information Systems at the New York-based institution in September.

Commenting on her selection, an elated Johnson indicated that, "It's a dream come true and I'm really happy and grateful for the opportunity to be able to take the next step toward achieving my goals."

She further added that her decision to venture into computer studies resulted from an enduring interest in all things technology. She said that she is very excited about the possibilities that lie ahead.

The IBI-Monroe partnership began in 2014 and has benefited three (3) students to date; Mr. Onel Harrison, the first recipient is in his final phases of study.

Johnson hails from the humble community of Jointwood, St. Elizabeth. She was presented with the scholarship in a small ceremony at King's House on September 11, 2018 by His Excellency the Governor-General.

Students eligible to apply for a scholarship through the programme include high school graduates who have attained passes at both the Caribbean Secondary Examinations Council (CSEC) and Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) levels.

If provided, the next round of selections will take place in July 2019 for the 2019/20 academic year.

REPORT CARD: ONEL HARRISON

Each year, The I Believe Initiative partners with Munroe College based in New York, USA to award scholarships for study in the field of Computer Science. Mr. Onel Harrison was the 2014 recipient. This is what he shared of his progress in 2017:

66 I became a Fusemachines AI Fellow in January, and since then, I've completed 75% of the course-based learning activities. As part of the Fellowship, fellows I had to work to complete Columbia University's MicroMasters in Artificial Intelligence.

I also became a CODE2040 Fellow where I was exposed to a variety of new ideas and perspectives, learned new technologies, and made new friends. CODE2040 is a non-profit organization and community on a mission to ensure the full representation and leadership of Black and Latinx people in the innovation economy by creating pathways to their educational, professional, and entrepreneurial success in tech. I worked on multiple new features in the ListenFirst Product including Content Tagging, and some unreleased features. In doing so, I learned how to build user interfaces with React, which we adopted in the latter part of 2017.

On the Move:

I now publish pieces on Medium and have articles published in the Towards Data Science and freeCodeCamp publications, two of Medium's largest tech publications.

I started volunteering as a web developer at the ACMF while the organization was in its infancy early in 2017. I did this at the request of my mentor and current president and executive director of the ACMF Dr. Genieve Brown-Metzger, a powerhouse of a person I've known since I began college. **??**
