This retired school principal often reflects on the hard work of her mother, who made and sold men's underpants from flour boxes to support her education. She served fervently in her role as Principal of Santa Cruz Primary and Junior High School, encouraging students and teachers to reach their maximum potential.

This Florida University graduate launched a GoFundMe campaign earlier this year to gift students from low-income families in South Manchester with tablets to access lessons online. A total of 45 tablets were gifted to students across 13 schools. The students were also supported in setting up JN Easi Save accounts.



**Mrs. Marsha Allen-Russell**  
Over 35 Category

Mrs. Marsha Allen-Russell is an educator from the parish of Manchester. Her impressive professional track record has landed her several awards and leadership roles. She was among 30 persons selected from across the region to participate in the Organisation of American States (OAS) Teacher Leadership Project. Only two Jamaicans were chosen for this project to support teacher engagement, advocacy, mentorship, and sustainability. Mrs. Allen-Russell was placed as the second runner-up in the Lasco Teacher of the Year Award for 2019-2020 and is known for her work as an author of Nelson Thorn's Integrated Science Study Guide, used widely by students across the Caribbean region preparing for their CSEC exams.



**Mr. Jowayne Hudson, JP**  
18-24 Category

Mr. Jowayne Hudson is an academic standout who has dedicated himself to sustained and selfless volunteerism. He has received numerous academic awards and academic recognition, most notably securing the third-highest placement in the Caribbean for CSEC Electrical and Electronic Technology in 2019. As the Deputy Head Boy and Prefect of Titchfield High School, Jowayne has done much to increase students' interests in STEM-based education at the institution, being the founder and vice-president of the Robotics and Computer Lab. In 2019, he founded the 'Giving Others Love through Charity', which focuses on providing support to those less privileged. Mr. Hudson has also provided voluntary service to the Port Antonio Hospital, offering relief to children in the Paediatric Ward and conducting several beautification activities.



**Mr. Chase Roberts, JP**  
25-35 Category

He has dedicated countless voluntary services to community and youth development through his involvement with several government and private organisations in Portland.

Mr. Nahjae Nunes' outstanding academic performance and leadership goes beyond our Jamaican borders. As a student of the Sciences at Munro College, Mr. Nunes secured seven grade ones at the CSEC level before moving on to the Caribbean Maritime University (CMU) to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Logistics and Supply Chain Management. Earlier this year, he completed his studies at CMU with a grade point average of 4.0. As an 'I Believe' Initiative Ambassador, Mr. Nunes is committed to youth development.
