By eventide on the date marking the liberation of slaves - Emancipation Day on August 1, 1991, The Most Honourable Sir Howard Felix Hanlan Cooke, was sworn in as Jamaica's fourth, native-born Governor-General. The man whose career spanned several spheres in business, academia, politics and philanthropy, was now steward of the nation's affairs.

Sir Howard was no stranger to denting the annals of history with firsts. As then Governor-General, he started the tradition of seeking out and recognising excellence amongst the nation's grassroots by using the Governor-General Achievement Awards to pay homage to community stalwarts.

Sir Howard laid the foundation for what we celebrate today, *A Tapestry of Excellence*.

THE GGAA: AN IDEA IS BORN

A story told by
Hugh Morris



A former National Coordinator of The GGAA, Hugh Morris, beams with pride as he recalls his journey which began in 2004, when he assumed the mantle of what was more than just an ordinary award programme.

"It gave you a sense of joy and pride," said Morris, explaining how it felt to see hundreds of ordinary Jamaicans receive The Governor-General's Achievement Award (GGAA) in the early days after the award was first established in 1991.

"One could not go through those ceremonies without recognising the contribution - when you heard the stories, when you read the citations of the recipients," he said.

"It was a moment of pride for everybody," he reflected, explaining that the award programme

was set up to honour "unsung heroes".

"These are the people who don't beat the pan and say look this is who I am. They are often laid-back people, and they do the thing because they enjoy doing it," he said.

The GGAA was over a decade old when Morris was brought on to share his expertise. The

Award dates back to 1991, when the late Hon. Douglas Fletcher, former lawyer and public figure, proposed the idea of setting up a programme that puts the spotlight on outstanding Jamaicans, specifically those from humble beginnings.

He drew the attention of then Chairman of The Gleaner Company Limited to the "Horatio Alger" Awards in the United States, which highlights achievers in various areas who emerged in the public eye from humble circumstances. Perhaps because of his own humble beginnings, the idea struck a chord with then Governor-General Sir Howard Cooke, an educator turned politician, who served as the representative of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. After a discussion with Sir Howard, the project was launched under the distinguished patronage of The Governor-General, with support from the Building Societies,

The Gleaner Company, the Custodes, and representatives from the legal, business, and religious communities across Jamaica.

It was a novel idea, particularly in a country where only people from higher echelons of society were often recognised at the national level.

"For him these are the people who laboured in the rural communities, making things happen. Whether the nurses, teachers, police officers, community workers or whatever, they were using their time as volunteers," recalled Morris. Morris succeeded Larkin Hall, who was himself preceded by Mr. Roy Dickson and Mr. Henri Hendricks before him. Before his appointment, Morris had been invited to several award ceremonies by Hall and the Hon. Earl Jarrett, the head of Jamaica National, who was one of the first sponsors on board. "While I was working at the Jamaica National, they [Hall and Jarrett] continued to invite me to award ceremonies," Morris said. "At that time, I did not know the reason, but it gave me more exposure," he continued.

CELEBRATING THE UNSUNG HEROES:

THE FIRST CEREMONIES

The story by **Hugh Morris** continued...

"I would leave Kingston, let us say, on a Tuesday morning and would have my first meeting in St. Elizabeth for 10 o'clock and from St. Elizabeth, I would go on for a 2 o'clock meeting in Westmoreland. I overnighted in Westmoreland and then had a 10 o'clock meeting in Hanover" said Hugh Morris, former National Coordinator of The Governor-General's Achievement Awards, as he explained how the programme took shape in the early days. They set out to find the unsung heroes by employing a process of collaboration at the national and parish level. A working committee was established inside King's House itself. "These were people who were part of the Public Relations [staff] of the sponsoring groups. They came religiously to planned meetings," explained Morris.

The Working Committee supported a wide-ranging National Committee. That is what Morris, the fourth in a line of National Coordinators, unearthed when he joined the programme.

"The National Committee involved people from a broad sector. Though it was chaired by The Governor-General, it had an island-wide implication. The National Committee had the Custodes, Jamaica Teachers' Association, the legal practice, businesses, communities and the religious sector", Morris said.

"As National Coordinator (you) answered to The Governor-General and the National Committee," said Morris. "At the parish level (you) had to meet with the Custodes and the Custodes had a Parish Committee made up mostly of Justices of the Peace and of course people representing the different backgrounds - JTA (Jamaica Teachers' Association), nursing, social workers and the police", he added.

Bringing People Together

The real impact of the Initiative was the public at large. Once the awardees were selected, ceremonies were arranged at the County level. Recipients would be in attendance in the presence of The Governor-General. At one of the ceremonies, Morris recalls a podium stand he had created that featured a big portrait of the Governor-General. This was replicated at the County stage, where each Parish was responsible for hosting their own function.

"Can you imagine us going to have a function in Westmoreland and there are people who are traveling from Trelawny, Hanover, St. Elizabeth who had never travelled to that next door Parish and they were all dressed up in their Sunday best and going to be in the presence of The Governor-General," emphasised Morris.

He said despite the hard work, the reward is seeing the joy and gratitude of those whose contributions to nation-building are often overlooked.

"The satisfaction was that people showed appreciation. There was a vicarious celebration on my part when I heard those stories and reflected on – and I must reiterate this, the words of Sir Howard Cooke when he spoke about the 'unsung heroes'", he asserted. "It really means a lot to be able to foster an opportunity for us as a nation, to give recognition to those who contribute to nation-building – that's what The GGAA means to me," he opined.

SPOTLIGHT

PORTRAIT OF SERVICE

In 1994, Selvin Augustus Graham was awarded the Governor-General Achievement Award for the parish of St. Mary. His story was one of how determination, hard work and innovation, while investing in community, can transform a life from poverty to prosperity.

He was raised by his grandmother and by the time he was a young teenager, he was already in the job market after only completing formal education at the elementary (primary) school level.

He established a string of businesses, starting as a peanut vendor in Highgate, St. Mary - his hometown, transporting goods, and then went on to owning businesses like a supermarket, and block factory to others such as a hardware, real estate brokerage firm and cattle farm.

He credited the rapport he's had with residents in his community for his success. This is why, as he developed more and more businesses, he continued to invest more heavily in his community; which is in line with his guiding philosophy and what he told the Gleaner newspaper in 1994, "work hard to invest in people and community." He noted that in order to

become successful, one key attribute to have is the will to work hard and the discipline to avoid temptations that point to quick rewards or 'easy money'.

"I saved, and I just worked hard, took my time, allowed things to mature at certain intervals, and now I can buy the big car if I want," Graham told the Gleaner in 1994. At the time when he was recognised by the Governor-General, Graham had already received special awards from the Lions Club and the Jaycees (United States Junior Chamber) movement in the parish.

A New Governor-General Takes Office

On the 16th of February 2006, Kenneth Octavius Hall became Jamaica's fifth Governor-General since Independence and he set his sights on refining The GGAA. For him, this meant incorporating what described as a critical but often overlooked segment of Jamaican society - young people. "My thrust, having come as I did from long periods in academia", he said, was that "we should be expanded to include what I consider to be the more dynamic components of the Jamaican society."

"I wanted to find a way of encouraging participation by the youth of the country," explained Sir Kenneth. "At the time we thought probably 50 per cent of the persons we were talking about were born after; certainly the majority of the persons after 2006 had been born after Independence," he explained.

Youth Categories are Introduced

The GGAA was therefore expanded to include academic excellence, along with volunteerism among persons in the 18-24 and 25-35 age groups.

This was in alignment with Sir Kenneth's interest in youth development which arose from the fact that like his predecessor, Sir Howard, he too had been an educator. At the time of his appointment to the post of Governor-General, Sir Kenneth had built a solid reputation in the local, regional and international academic communities with over four decades' experience as a scholar and a Higher Education administrator.

This included serving as Principal and Pro-vice Chancellor of the Mona Campus of the University of the West Indies (UWI) and in the United States at Syracuse University and various campuses throughout the State University of New York system. Additionally, Sir Kenneth expanded the Award Programme to acknowledge the contribution of the Diaspora to visibly show appreciation for the work of Jamaican communities existing externally to the island.

According to Sir Kenneth, the selection process emphasised community

involvement. "Those awards were made on the understanding that the selection process, and I want to emphasise this, would be coming from those who were beneficiaries, from the community and not people like me sitting in Kingston," he said.

Since then, the programme has recruited and established a network of teachers and educators, the various Parish Custodes, as well as private sector interests such as the Jamaica National Building Society, Victoria Mutual Building Society, The Jamaica Gleaner, and the Scotia Foundation. One key new feature during the Hall administration, was the establishment of breakfast meetings at which young people would discuss issues from their perspectives. Big Topics tackled by the youth in these meetings included notions of what constitutes a family and the need to recognise the work of single-parent units in raising youth.

"I saw it really as a continuation of the programme that I inherited," he said, explaining that he wanted to continue building on the civic role of the Office of The Governor-General. "The office of the Governor-General is sometimes seen as ceremonial and has nothing to do with our lives, has nothing to do with governance in Jamaica, has little to do with what people do at the community level. I think my predecessor started it, and I continued and I know that Sir Patrick continues, to make the office part of the civic life of the country," he asserted.

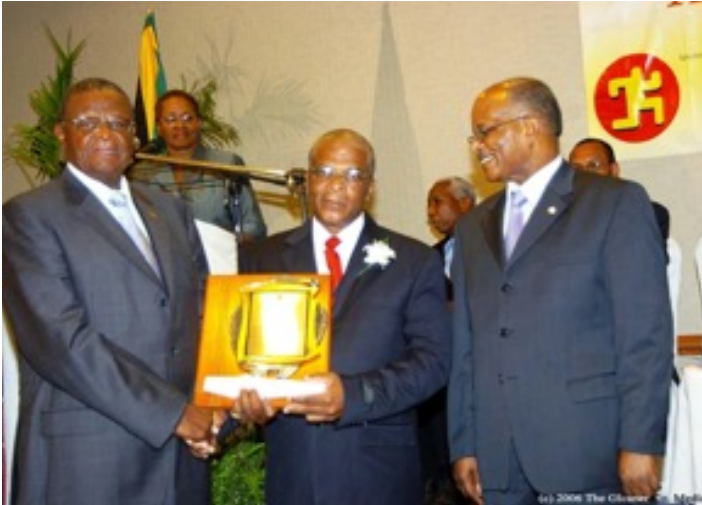

His Excellency The Most Honourable Sir Patrick Allen became the sixth Governor-General of independent Jamaica on February 26, 2009. With his appointment, he also became Patron of The Governor-General's Achievement Awards (GGAA) programme, which recognises the work of his predecessors and signals the significant work to be done.

To continue raising the bar, Sir Patrick Allen has been keen on confirming recipients of incomparable records of service and, most importantly, embodying a culture of excellence. "People should have something to aspire to," said His Excellency in affirming the high scrutiny of nominees.

The GGAA has considerably evolved over the years and with His Excellency Sir Patrick Allen spending most of his career primarily as an administrator, it was innate for him to further develop the programme to best fit the Jamaica of the day. He believes that to mend the country's social fabric, one should not only be awarded for work done, but there should be a deliberate attempt to encourage volunteerism in the citizenry at large.

Even as the nation grapples with the COVID-19 pandemic, Sir Patrick continues

to encourage innovative ways to promote work being done within the GGAA. To this end, the first ever virtual ceremonies were held for both the 2020 and 2021 staging of the Awards Programme, featuring musical performances and messages from key sponsors. The 2021 GGAA Diaspora Awards focused on celebrating 'the Heroes of the Pandemic', those whose relentless contributions have kept Jamaicans, at home and abroad, safe and taken the country one step closer to recovery.

Sir Patrick Allen firmly believes that "*there is nothing wrong with Jamaica that cannot be fixed by what is right with Jamaica*" – a statement made at his inauguration that laid the foundation for what would later become the '**I Believe' Initiative (IBI)**.

"The 'I Believe' Initiative inspires hope. It inspires us to do better. We are not daunted by difficulties and obstacles but we can push ahead and surmount the difficulties"



“What he really wanted to do,” explains Nicholas Chambers, a consultant who worked with the Office of The Governor-General, to help develop the **‘I Believe’ Initiative**, “was to inspire people to say *I believe* that I can be better or I can use what is right with Jamaica to fix the things that are wrong with Jamaica”.

May 2021 marked a decade since the inception of The **‘I Believe’ Initiative**, known originally as a public-facing campaign designed to inspire Jamaicans, to believe in themselves and achieve their God-given potential. Before the launch of The IBI, Sir Patrick Allen leveraged the Breakfast Forum created by his predecessor Sir Kenneth Hall, to hold consultations with youth and community leaders. The findings of these consultations were used to establish ‘Family’, ‘Youth’, and ‘Education’ as the three pillars of The IBI. They also formed the framework for many of the sub-programmes launched under The IBI.

Even before its official launch, The IBI has had a longstanding reputation for mentorship and outreach work that benefited young people at the Glenhope Place of Safety, St. Patrick’s Foundation, the Juvenile Remand Centre and the Bustamante Children’s Hospital. The official launch was held at King’s House on May 10, 2011 and was attended by students, sponsors and then Prime Minister Mr. Bruce Golding, who became the first IBI Ambassador. It was here

that The IBI Song, written by Jermaine Johnson, was sung for the first time, featuring a youth choir of 37 youngsters.

The Initiative seeks to achieve its mission and vision by creating, contributing and endorsing projects that fall under The IBI pillars of ‘Youth’, ‘Education’ and ‘Family’. These pillars are designed to help with focusing efforts on the most critical areas of personal and community development. They also allow us to tell a clear and compelling story of the collective efforts of the IBI and to engage audiences in our work.

Family

Positively influencing the upbringing of our nation’s children through the instilment of good values and capacity-building activities.

Youth

Reaching youth with interventions that empower them to excel and inspire others to do the same.

Education

Mobilising resources that bridge access to quality education for our nation’s citizens.



THE GGPE IS BORN

The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence (GGPE), launched in 2014 by His Excellency Sir Patrick Allen, is the civic initiative emanating from the Office of The Governor-General. Until 2014, The **'I Believe' Initiative** (IBI) and The Governor-General's Achievement Awards (GGAA) co-existed as separate programmes. The GGPE was devised and launched to oversee both the IBI and GGAA.

Major (Ret'd) Effiom Whyte was the first National Coordinator of the newly established GGPE. Major Whyte, a retired pilot, served the GGPE for four years and was supported by its first Project Officer, Ms. Tricia Grier, who chiefly coordinated the implementation of The GGPE's activities.

It was Ms. Tricia Grier who signalled the need for the GGPE, where all the social programmes at King's House were previously managed independently of each other. Ms. Grier believed that this move was a step in the right direction, presenting the GGPE as a consolidated Programme which enabled a greater mobilisation for resources and people.

By 2018, the Governor-General Jamaica Trust (GGJT) was formed as a registered charity that houses the GGPE and other non-profit activities coordinated by King's House.

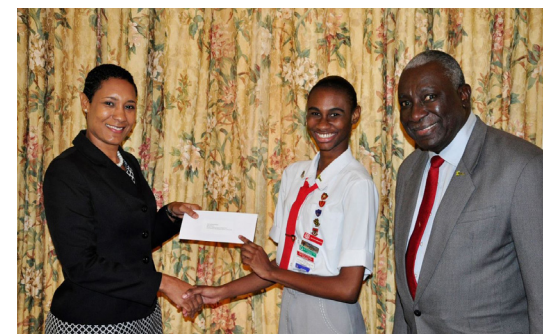

PARENTING NOW!

Parenting Now is a programme under The **'I Believe' Initiative (IBI)** that focuses on the holistic development of young people by equipping parents with the skills and resources needed for effective parenting. The Programme is guided by the scientific notion that parenting, the primary source of socialisation, impacts on the development of young people who later become active members of society.

Parenting Now was traditionally delivered to virtual audiences through various radio broadcasts led by Dr. Barry Davidson and Dr. Faith Linton. On RJR, listeners would join Parenting101 on the first Sunday of every month, while on MelloFM listeners would join Just for Parents every other Wednesday.

To date, almost thirty (30) episodes of Parenting101 and fifty (50) episodes of Just for Parents have been broadcast on radio. These were complemented by 15-30 seconds bites that would be shared throughout the day. A wide range of topics were explored during these programmes, including relationship and firmness, parenting styles, the growth of intelligence and fatherhood.

With a straightening of the secretariat of The GGPE and sponsorships, it is a hope that all of these ground-breaking programmes and initiatives will be able to continue and evolve to greater depths and higher heights.

THE IBI AMBASSADOR

'I Believe' Ambassadors are youth and community champions invited by His Excellency Sir Patrick Allen, Governor-General to influence networks, lead inspiring projects and represent the mantra of the IBI, "Using what's right with Jamaica to fix what's wrong with Jamaica".

IBI Ambassadors may be identified in all fourteen parishes and are encouraged to steer local initiatives and rally efforts for regional and national events. Some ambassadors may have strong national and international influence and would have been installed as an IBI ambassador on such merit. The hope is that they too would use their platform to inspire and energise Jamaicans to work towards building a stronger nation.

The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence (GGPE) receives scores of applications for new IBI Ambassadors each year. IBI Ambassadors support the successful planning and execution of projects done through the GGPE while collaborating on their own initiatives at the grassroot level. By 2020, three hundred and ten (310) persons had been installed as IBI Ambassadors.

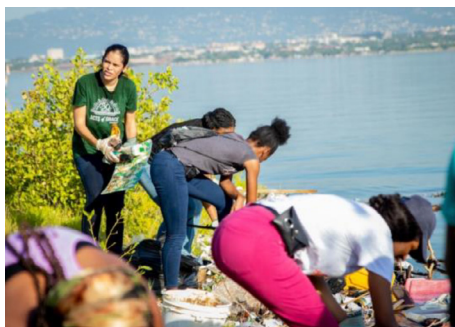

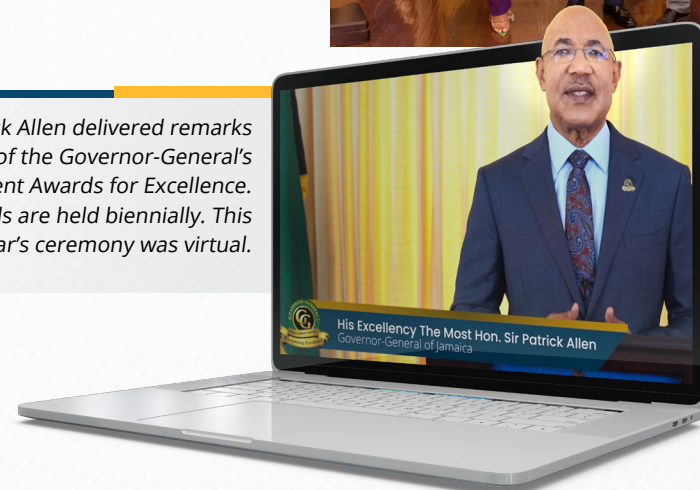

SUMMER OF SERVICE (SOS) PROGRAMME

In the spirit of excellence, Sir Patrick launched the Summer of Service Scholarship (SOS); a programme designed to encourage volunteerism among Jamaica's youth while they pursue undergraduate studies. Since its inception in 2013, beneficiaries of this programme have documented the SOS experience as one that instils positive values such as community stewardship, determination and persistence.

Annual scholarship commitments are made possible through the generous support of corporate and educational institutions. By 2021, 68.2 million Jamaican dollars have been issued in scholarships to students from varying academic fields. The SOS targets young people who face great financial hardships, but still continue to give to others.

The current GGPE National Coordinator Mr. Abraham Simmonds became one of the first recipients of the SOS Scholarship in 2013. "I was so elated to have received this scholarship and it meant the world to me because very little opportunities came to rural Jamaica" recalled Mr. Simmonds. "My mother was actually about to use a piece of newspaper to wrap something in the kitchen when we found the scholarship just before the deadline," he said.

At the time, Abraham was the Executive Director of Jamaican Youth Empowerment through Culture, Arts and Nationalism (JAYECAN). In a letter to His Excellency, Abraham said that his SOS experience was an opportunity that led him to realise the power of social action and youth leadership in positioning Jamaica on the global scene. JAYECAN comprises a group of university students (UWI and UTECH) who, through teams, develop and execute projects that help empower other youth. Abraham Simmonds was also pinned as an IBI Ambassador in 2015.

SPOTLIGHT

A SUMMER OF SERVICE A LIFE OF SUCCESS

Through the SOS, Abraham received a three-year scholarship sponsored by the University of the West Indies and later received the Chevening Scholarship to pursue a Master's degree in the United Kingdom. "Serving as the National Coordinator of The GGPE is an incredible honour and I did not know then (2013) that this scholarship would have caused me to move on to accomplishing so much and so I will work even harder to improve and scale these programmes," Abraham added.

YOUTH CONSULTATIVE CONFERENCE (YCC)

The Youth Consultative Conferences (YCC) started in 2011 as an expansion of the previously held breakfast forums. There were typically three conferences each year, one in each county that focused on addressing issues impacting Jamaica's youth.

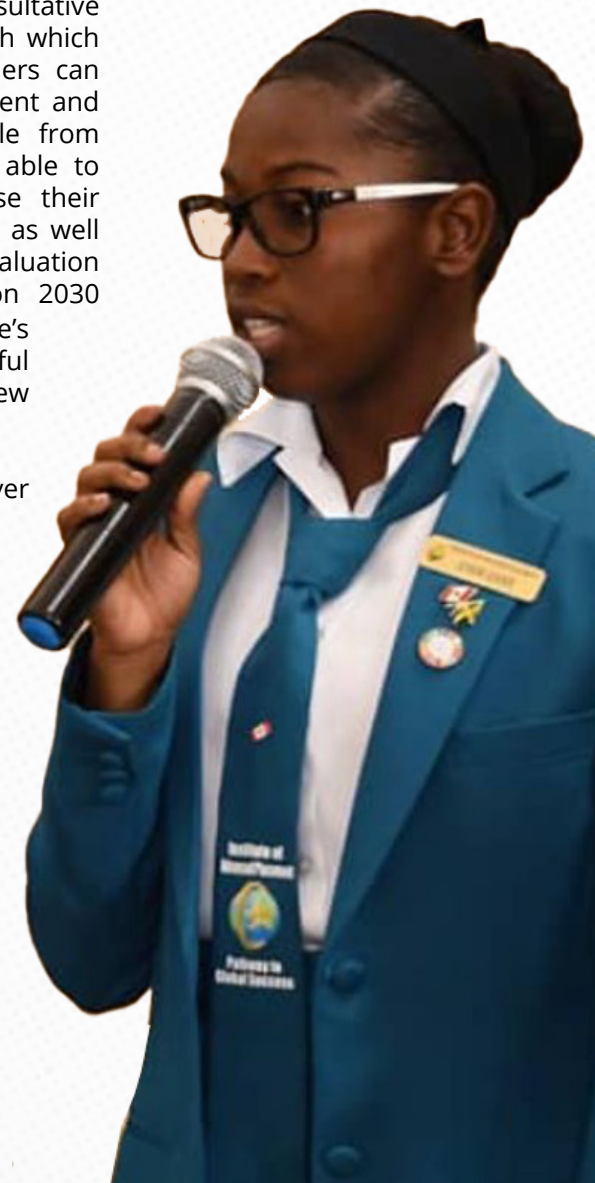

The Youth Consultative Conference (YCC) provides a forum through which young people can strategise workable solutions to address social ills. It provides a platform for Jamaican youth to express their concerns and suggest ways in which youth can be involved in organisations that promote the building of a nation and propose avenues and alternatives to solve problems. Participants in the YCC are drawn from communities and institutions across the island and are between the ages of 17 and 35 years. Previous conferences have facilitated dialogue around specific social issues affecting youth such as mental health, human trafficking, drug abuse, *inter alia*.

The Governor-General's Youth Consultative Conference has become a platform through which youth, youth entities and other stakeholders can discuss issues relevant to youth development and engagement. At this forum, young people from multiple disciplines and backgrounds are able to contribute to policy discussions, showcase their collective ideas, solutions, and innovations, as well as participate in the monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of Jamaica's Vision 2030 Development Plan. Addressing young people's priorities, needs, rights, and their meaningful participation in the implementation and review of Vision 2030 is integral for future success.

The YCC typically sees the participation of over one thousand youth from educational institutions across the island; and has featured world renowned keynote presenters such as Mr. Alvin Day, Toon Boom CEO Joan Vogelsang and renowned reggae musician and celebrity chef, Levi Roots.

THE GGPE & THE NEW NORM

Faced with a global pandemic, The Governor-General's Programme for Excellence (GGPE) is determined to deliver tailored activities that respond to new and emerging needs. The start of the pandemic in 2020, rendered a cancellation or postponement of several plans in the same year. With the need to reach its intended audience, the GGPE designed a robust digital strategy that became an integral part of programme. In light of the world's 'new normal', the digital transition has shifted gears, resulting in The Governor-General's Achievement Awards (GGAA) nominations being received and managed via an electronic application system. Over 300 nominations were submitted in 2020 and in 2021, The GGPE recorded an unprecedented number of nominations of over 800 nominations for The GGAA.

Since then, the team has added focus on marking the 30th Anniversary of The GGPE — 30 Years of GGAA and 10 Years of the IBI — in a celebration themed "A Tapestry of Excellence." In recognition of the many years of contribution to nation-building, the GGPE's leadership put on a stellar online production of the GGAA that would usually be a well-attended in-person event. The pre-production and attention to detail gave the end product an excellent finish, leaving awardees and well-wishers in awe. A significant component of the Anniversary year was to name three special awardees, one nominated from each county. Governor-General, Sir Patrick Allen made this presentation at the heavily scaled-down viewing of the coveted Awards Ceremony at King's House.

The '**I Believe**' Initiative also took to the tide by having the installation of ambassadors online. The year has since seen the IBI Ambassadors rise to deliver essential gear and services while

employing creative approaches for virtual peer mentorship and support.

The GGPE owes much of its current success to a dedicated team of individuals who have provided financial and human capital support to the project. Entities such as Digicel, the Embassy of the People's Republic of China, First Regional Co-operative Credit Union, and the Spanish Court Hotel, alongside public relations expert Jean Lowrie Chin and consultant Nicholas Chambers, were among the first to respond to the call for support.

The Initiative has also partnered with KingsTOON to support creatives and young professionals wishing to enter the creative industries. Sir Patrick notes that "the future of the programme lies in the hands of the ambassadors". He pointed out that at age ten, with the continued commitment of the sponsors and the ambassadors themselves, the GGPE's future looks bright.

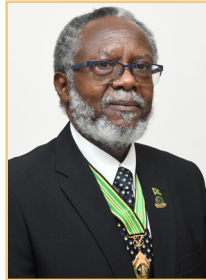

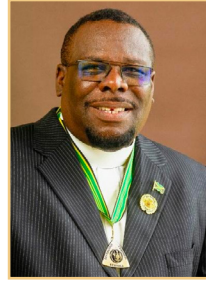

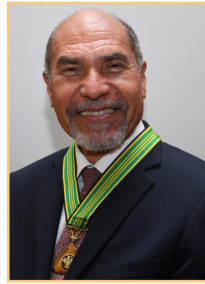
